No matter what decisions are made at senior level, we at Warringah need to continue with our programs and work for our club and our community. It's getting tougher every year but the rewards are enormous.

### Looking To The Future


We have introduced some wonderful programs in 2013, some of which include:

### Junior Development Program

### A New Era Begins

We had a fantastic preseason in which all of the boys made some large gains, not only physically but mentally, especially after enduring a near 24 hour torture session at the hands of our defence forces! Our preparation was briefly disrupted with the departure of our Head Coach Sam Harris, who accepted a professional coaching role in Japan only weeks out from the start of the season.

However the boys responded in the first competition game with an extremely dominant display over Penrith to kick the season off. The next few weeks would set up the scenario for what seemed to echo throughout the year. This involved regular nail biters. We lost rounds two and three to Norths and competition heavy weights Souths by only a point and then responded with a one point victory over defending premiers Sydney Uni at Uni. This win displayed the true character of our team and optimised the Rats spirit of rising to the adversity of previous weeks.

### Rising To Challenges

This spirit carried on to Randwick the week after with another one point victory due to a near miracle field goal by Dave Harvey 48 metres at full time. Unfortunately these close emotional games were starting to take its toll on the players. Both Manly and Parramatta beat us comprehensively whilst after leading by what seemed a winning margin, we allowed West Harbour to claw back into the game, to take us by only the slimmest of points right on full time.

It was at this stage during the season we learnt the hard lesson of having to be on top of our game week in and week out in order to compete



with the larger teams. To our credit, we knocked off Gordon with a great come back that showed masses of team maturity in the second half. And we came within whiskers of another upset against rugby heavy weights Sydney Uni with a show stopping game at Rat Park. Although we lost the game, the boys left the field with a well deserved standing ovation.

### Finals Glory So Close

After receiving a scrummaging lesson from the much larger Easts and Souths pack, we set the goal to win three out of our last five games to make the finals. We achieved our goal with a victory once again against Randwick at Randwick, in which it seemed to be raining tries. We made up for our earlier season touch up from our old bogey team Parramatta with clinical footy and also nailed another strong positive win against a West Harbour team, led by Wallaby James O'Connor.

With one game to go against minor premiers Eastwood, we thought a four try bonus point (which Mickey Adams secured for us with a 90 metre try on full time) would have secured us in the top 8. Unfortunately the ruaby gods were not with us and we lost on "for and against" to Randwick, who we had beaten twice throughout the year.

### Solid Future Ahead

2013 offered a plethora for our fans. Our backs were electric and arguably earned the title of most threatening in the competition, whilst our forwards showed an abundance of heart, to never take a backwards step.

Our set piece proved to be a challenge along with our inability to hold teams out once they entered our own 22 metres. By the season's end our boys had adapted to a style of play that was threatening no matter who the opposition was.

Going forward, our team that was once young up-and-comers has now graduated to hardened Grade players who have experienced all that the competition has to offer. At times this is not enjoyable but reaping the benefits that this maturity offers definitely will be evident for the seasons to come.

Thank you to all the players, support staff, club members and supporters for the belief and positivity shown to me in my first year of coaching. It was a season that I learnt a lot and thoroughly enjoyed.

### Trusting The Game Plan

I am submitting this report as a critical review of the 2013 season with the hope that the players involved in the campaign will reflect on the season and develop to become better players for their experiences this year.

It is widely acknowledged that Reserve grade is a notoriously difficult arade to achieve success in. There are unique challenges for a Reserve grade team which are inherent to the nature, position and make-up of the competition itself. Yet every year one team overcomes these difficulties to become the Premiers.

The challenge for the Coaching group in Reserve grade this year proved to be convincing the playing group to trust the game plan and for the players to have belief in their individual and collective ability!

### The Quest For Success

The 2013 Colin Caird Shield quest was both interesting and challenging. Overall it was a season marred by inconsistency between match day performances and inconsistency within match day performances.

A clinical review of each of our match results throughout the season reveals a distinct lack of respect for the bonus point system and more pointedly an apparent lack of respect for the role that defence plays in the overall success of a Rugby season.

Our "for and against" was significantly out of balance and ultimately impacted with our failure to reach the finals by a single point. However, success in a rugby season can be judged on many levels.

There is of course, the competition ladder. Our position here reflected



only moderate success. The fact that it came down to the last game to make the finals series was pleasing given our early season performances.

### Developing Talent

There is the level of enjoyment and camaraderie that is achieved within the squad inclusive of Coaches and Management. On this note, as a group it would be hard to imagine a nicer group of young men. Eager, respectful and committed (up to a point). While they were competitive as individuals, there was not enough team driven focus for success to carry us through the tougher game day challenges.

There is the advancement throughout the season of an individual player's and squad's rugby education and the increasing mastery in Rugby related skills. It is here that I believe the 2013 season was a great investment in player development moving forward. As the season wore on the players took greater ownership in the game plan and the in particular the skills required to carry it out. This resulted in some excellent Rugby being played later in the season and stands as evidence of the quality of players available for 2014.

Having gone through the growing pains of a new coaching staff with a new tactical approach and the

introduction of many players new to Reserve grade and indeed Warringah Rugby, I firmly believe another season together could result in the foundation of a formidable team with an already established rapport and understanding.

As Coach, I was always excited by the potential in the side and on occasion this potential was realised on match day performances. With an already established familiarity between coaching staff and players, the 2014 season could build significantly on the work and results achieved this season.

### Teamwork Was Key

From a personal perspective, it is always an honour and privilege to be given a Rugby coaching position. This affords you the opportunity to work with people who enjoy the game. Better than this, the stage you work on with these people requires teamwork, sacrifice, selflessness, expertise and many other virtues that reveal the character of an individual. ### Close Calls And Big Wins

3<sup>rd</sup> Grade has unearthed some awesome talent this year. particularly some of the juniors and schoolboys that helped us out during the season. Our returning veterans (most of whom are still eligible) have grown in grit and talent and will make a difference to the Rats success in future years. So many 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders played key roles backing up or being selected for higher grades throughout the season. They never failed to support the Colts group as a whole and showed real Rats spirit on and off the paddock.

The versatile Will Furness and Jake Price, talented link men Jono Millar, Bravden Witham, Lachlan Grant, Carlie Seuters and Ian Luciano, slick backs Sam Rose, Jackson Starhia, Jake Vale, Alex O'Shea, Brett Batchelor, Harry Thomsen, Josh Tomsen, Chad McMillian and a host of guest appearances and other contributions from far and wide. I am very appreciative of every player who strapped on the boots for us.

### Laying Foundations

While you could look at the table and say it was a tough season, we have laid down the building blocks for many more victories in the coming seasons. We were young and quick to learn technique but only slowly came to the realisation that more training and commitment is needed to turn effort and talent into results. 3rd Grade 2013 is a bellwether for the club, showing us the very real prospect of the Rats being a force in the Colts world for many years to

come if we choose to learn the lessons from this season.

I am personally very proud of all the players I had the privilege to coach this season, challenging them to become harder and better and seeing them rise to the occasion again and again. ### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a Special Purpose Financial Report.

The directors' determination is based upon the premise that a General Purpose Report places an unrealistic administrative requirement on the company.

No other Accounting Standards or other authoritative pronouncements of the

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs. It does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the directors to ensure it is not in excess of the amount recoverable from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employed and their subsequent disposal.

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets are depreciated over their estimated useful lives to the company commencing from the time the assets are acquired and held ready for use.

### (d) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and net of bank overdrafts.

### (e) Revenue

Revenue from rendering of a service is recognised upon delivery of the service to the customers. Other revenue is recognised when the right to receive that revenue has been established. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

### (f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of any GST except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or the expense item. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis, except for the GST components of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.


