Congratulations to the Ratettes and 1st grade colts for making it through to the finals up against very strong competition.

A community club doesn't happen without volunteers and the Rats are no different. Without our 'Rat Pack" of volunteers we simple wouldn't get the gates open and function, your service is deeply appreciated by the board and our community.

We say goodbye to players every year but this year we said goodbye to 4 players with over 700 games between them who have made an incredible contribution to the club and Sydney premier rugby. We also have wonderful new talent stepping up, who I'm sure will also grow into Rats legends across all teams including Rattettes.

I also want to welcome onboard Robyn Watson as the Rats new GM. Robyn's working experience will move the club forward in 2021 and out of our Covid hangover. I look forward to working with Robyn to deliver the board's objectives for 2021.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I have the privilege to present the Financial Year 2020 (FY20) Financial Statements for Warringah Rugby Club, which as been reviewed by the accountants, Morton O'Leary.

FY20 has been an unprecedented year and provided immense challenges to the club from both an operational and financial standpoint. The club navigated these challenges through the continued dedication and support of:

- Our sponsors, Friends of Warringah, service partners, volunteers, members, supporters, and the wider Rats community;
- · Coaches and players;
- · Christine and Guy for their efforts in administering the club;

Board's Commercial committee for tackling the various financial challenges that the Club has encountered this year.

I would like to thank the above stakeholders for their contributions that have enabled the Club to continue operations and meet our commitments in 2020 despite the difficult conditions.

FY20 financial performance recorded a (\$3,589) deficit. Whilst this is a disappointing result following last year's loss, it was expected due to weaker economic conditions, amplified by COVID-19.

- Total Income decline from prior year predominately driven by significant Game Day revenue reduction.
- Game Day revenue reduction was driven by fewer home games and Covid restrictions/protocols.
- Sponsorship revenue and Government Assistance Packages (eg: Job keeper, Cash flow Boost, small business grants) covered the majority of the club's operational fixed costs.
- Reduced expenses particularly in Club and Rugby operations were achieved through extensive cost cutting and optimisation.

With the current environment set to continue into 2021 season, the Club will continue to work closely with our stakeholders and navigate through these financial uncertainties.

To conclude, I will once again like to thank Guy for his hard work over the last two years and welcome Robyn to the Club. I look forward to working with Robyn in 2021 to deliver a sound and sustainable result.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Warringah Rugby Club has an enormous amount to be proud of in 2020.

That may seem a strange sentiment in a year that after the incredible feat of 3 consecutive Grand Finals including a Shute Shield Premiership in the previous 3 years to not making the finals in the 4th year. Everyone and every organisation across the country faced incredible challenges in 2020. Challenges not only to their character and resolve, but to their very ability to survive. WRC was not on its own in this regard. However, not only did the Club meet the challenges thrown at it and survive, in many ways came out stronger and managed to thrive and establish a base for a future of continuing success. It is a year of highlights that include:

- A new young 1st Grade Coach who placed his own stamp and vision on an extremely young team with many new
 faces. What came out of this is the foundation of a core of incredibly talented and committed players with a hunger
 to not only succeed but succeed wearing the Rats playing gear in front of the Rats Members, Sponsors and
 Supporters.
- More Members in every membership category in 2020 than 2019, despite the fact that at one stage the season looked like it may be cancelled and when it did get up and running, was shortened by 5 weeks and 2 home games from the original draw.
- Despite COVID restrictions and a massive change to how we were allowed to sit as opposed to our traditional ways
 of enjoying the games, there was an increase in crowd numbers for the Sydney University, Norths, Eastern Suburbs
 and Southern District home games than in 2019.
- Every Sponsor of the Club stuck so incredibly strong with the club, honouring every financial commitment, despite the impediments and impost being felt by their own companies. Friends of Warringah stood right there ready to jump in with any support needed should the Club not be able to navigate its way through such turbulent waters. This is on top of significant financial support, including Scone and our gym, having already come in.
- Northern Beaches Council immediately stepping in to provide relief as soon as the season was stopped and maintained this support through the year.
- Our Volunteers came to all three Norths home games, none of which WRC participated in, and the entire finals
 series hosted at Rat Park to ensure the Club got every financial benefit possible out of these fixtures. This was a truly
 remarkable sacrifice.
- An incredible victory over Finals bound Northern Suburbs in the last home game that not only provided a perfect farewell to four legends but demonstrated exactly what this new and emerging team will be capable of.
- Most importantly, and what needs to be understood and applauded, the sacrifices made by every contracted coach
 and player, PhysioWard and Christine. If these sacrifices had not been made, at the same time as still fulfilling every
 one of their contractual obligations, there was the distinct possibility that this report would not need to be written
 nor hold an AGM.

Adversity is a test of character. 2020 was a test that saw WRC not only pass but pass with distinction and develop a path for greater success on and off the field.

There is one other very important lesson.

It is knowledge. We as a Club/group have always known this, but probably taken for granted to some extent. We are the most popular, most followed Club. We know this and this is something we should be justifiably proud of. But what has become apparent, after hosting home games for another club and the Semi-Finals and Preliminary Finals, is that with this comes a big responsibility. The game of Rugby can not grow and get back to where it was in the country's consciousness and popularity without eyes on the game. The game

needs Warringah's popularity. It needs the passion of our supporters and sponsors. It needs the noise and atmosphere we generate at home and away games. It's a hard fact then that rugby needs Warringah to be successful year on year. And Warringah needs to be successful for rugby. That's the challenge for the future. To always find success. Always be a Club of choice for players, sponsors and spectators. It's not about a Sydney University type success. It's about the continued growth and improvement in all those areas we already lead the way in.

- · Norths games we averaged 4 volunteers.

While all volunteers did a fantastic job and put in the long hours, Jim & Ian were outstanding and put in more of their time even when not asked.

Looking ahead, taking into account the world epidemic as I write, there is still a dark cloud hanging over our world before we can plan ahead with confidence. I estimate the first trial game will be on the 20 March 2021. We will plan a get together and recruitment day a couple of weeks before kickoff of the season.

WELFARE REPORT

A club wide Domestic Violence workshop will again be held.
